Youth Orchestra Level—DC Youth Orchestra Program (Level I Jury Audition)

The DC Youth Orchestra Program is not exclusive. All students who audition from outside the program WILL BE PLACED into an ensemble for their level and instrument. The most advanced students are placed in the most advanced ensemble, the Youth Orchestra.

* Musicians may audition with solo materials that are a comparable level of difficulty to those solo works listed. It is recommended that solo selections outside of those listed be grade 4-6. Accompanists are not required and not recommended.

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Auditioning FAQ:

Basic information about *The Program*: The DC Youth Orchestra Program is an ensemble-based music education program that has been providing music education and performance opportunities to the young people of the greater DC area since 1960. *The Program* is structured around a 12-level curriculum that allows all students to participate, regardless of ability. *The Program* also places tremendous priority on making sure that students can participate regardless of income level or socioeconomic background. As a result of this priority and through the generosity of area donors, costs are kept affordable and financial aid options are available for all those who qualify.

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The most advanced students are placed in the most advanced ensemble, the Youth Orchestra.

Who should audition?

Any student who already has experience with their instrument will be auditioned for placement, (all those who are NOT beginning an instrument for the first time). Placement auditions are used to determine which orchestra/ensemble each student will rehearse and perform with, based on the proficiency demonstrated during the audition. Each audition is heard by one or more qualified faculty members.

My son doesn't know how to play an instrument yet, does he need to audition?

Students who are joining *The Program* as beginners and have never played their choice instrument do not need to audition. Beginners can simply register for class. Beginning students sign up to begin attending *The Program* at "level A."

What should I prepare for the audition?

Advanced students Students who are targeting the most advanced levels of *The Program* audition using the audition materials on the reverse side of this sheet. Audition materials are specific and listed by instrument.

Intermediate students Students who are *not* targeting participation in the most advanced levels of *The Program* are asked to be prepared with their current lesson materials or current school orchestra/band materials to play for faculty. Generally, students with any experience on their instrument will need to participate in a placement audition. The purpose of the audition is to determine the most appropriate class and ensemble for the student and all students are accepted into *The Program*.

Beginning students There is no need for beginning students to audition, simply sign up for the instrument of choice (please see age restrictions) when registering for classes, at "level A."

What happens if my audition doesn't go well?

The highly qualified faculty of the DC Youth Orchestra Program do an incredible job of placing students into the level most appropriate to their ability. Even a student who does not play well will likely be placed appropriately. In the rare case that the assigned level proves to be inaccurate, an adjustment to the student level (up or down) will be made.

What happens if I target the Youth Orchestra but don't make it in?

Those students who target the Youth Orchestra but do not make it into the Youth Orchestra will be placed in another ensemble of *The Program*. Opportunities to re-audition for the Youth Orchestra take place every fall and winter (September and January). Opportunities to participate in a jury exam to move up through the levels of *The Program* take place seven (7) times annually.

Is there a fee to audition?

There is no cost to take an audition with *The Program*.

How do I schedule an audition?

Please include the student's full name, age or grade level, number of years experience, instrument, and applicable contact information (please include a telephone number). Auditions are scheduled year-round for *The Program*; auditions for the Youth Orchestra are held twice annually.
