DCYOP REGISTRATION PLATFORM

DCYOP's registration platform is a program called Jumbula.

You will use Jumbula to log into your DCYOP account to register and to update payment information or other general account information.

Visit <https://dcyop.jumbula.com/Login> and follow the instructions provided in the program.

To update your payment information please follow the instructions below:

- Go to <https://dcyop.jumbula.com/Login>
- If you do not remember your login, click "forgot password".
- Choose Payment methods from the top right menu.
- Click on "Add payment method".
- Add the credit card information and check the box that says, "Set this credit card as preferred." You may still need to pay any overdue installments manually by clicking on them and entering the information again.

DCYOP SATURDAY PROGRAM OVERVIEW

The timing of your child's rehearsal depends on the level in which they are enrolled.

DCYOP Staff will be on-site from 8:00am to 4:00pm.

Classes and rehearsals run from 9:00am to 3:30pm.

A Floor Monitor will be available to assist families during classes and rehearsals.

Registration for beginner students is for a full program year and open only in the fall to new students.

DCYOP COMMUNITY

Agreements

Guidelines to ensure a safe and respectful environment.

Communication: DCYOP will communicate with families primarily through email and the DCYOP website. Please ensure a correct email is on file with the DCYOP staff. It is the responsibility of all participants, students, and guardians to regularly check DCYOP's website and their email for messages and announcements from the administrative and program staff.

Courtesy and Respect for Each Other: All students, parents, and guardians are expected to behave courteously and respectfully towards each other, their conductor and teachers, administrative staff, and board members. Courtesy and respect are expected at rehearsals, performances, and any DCYOP activity or event.

Arrive Fully Prepared: Students are expected to come to every rehearsal fully prepared, having practiced their music. They should bring their instrument, music, and any necessary accessory they need to participate fully in rehearsals (ex: pencils, extra strings, rosin, reeds, mutes, rock-stops, etc.). DCYOP does not sell musical accessories and is not able to repair instruments on-site. If a student loses their music, they can download and print it from the DCYOP Music Library.

Rehearsal/Class Etiquette: During rehearsals and classes, DCYOP students should focus their full attention on their musical work. Use of cell phones or other electronic devices, and all other non-musical tasks, are prohibited. Students should remain seated and ready to play at all times, except during assigned breaks. Parents and guardians are not allowed in ensemble rehearsals and must wait in designated parent waiting areas, which are subject to change each Saturday.

DCYOP staff may take disciplinary action with students who are disruptive or behaving disrespectfully as needed to preserve a beneficial class environment for all students.

Respect for Property: DCYOP is a guest at Takoma Elementary School (TES) and is responsible to respect the facility, furniture, and equipment. As such, only TES and DCYOP staff may move furniture or equipment. Students and participants are asked not to remove chairs or desks from their classroom and not touch computers or other classroom equipment in their rehearsal spaces. Food and drink are not permitted in classrooms or in the rehearsal spaces.

Attendance Policy: Students are expected to attend every rehearsal, sectional, and class. In the case of an emergency or unavoidable absence, parents are asked to notify DCYOP as soon as possible by submitting the Attendance Notification Form available in the Attendance Policy document.

Floor Monitors During Rehearsals: Every Saturday, a DCYOP Team member is stationed on each floor to assist students, teachers, and parents. To report an incident on Saturday or receive guidance regarding a situation, please see a Floor Monitor or contact the Program Manager, Tim Provost at tim@dcyop.org.

DCYOP Closure and Cancellation Policy: DCYOP follows the DC Public Schools (DCPS) calendar and policies for closure. If DCPS is closed for weekend activities, then all DCYOP events are cancelled. DCYOP will notify families via social media and email of any closures or cancellations.

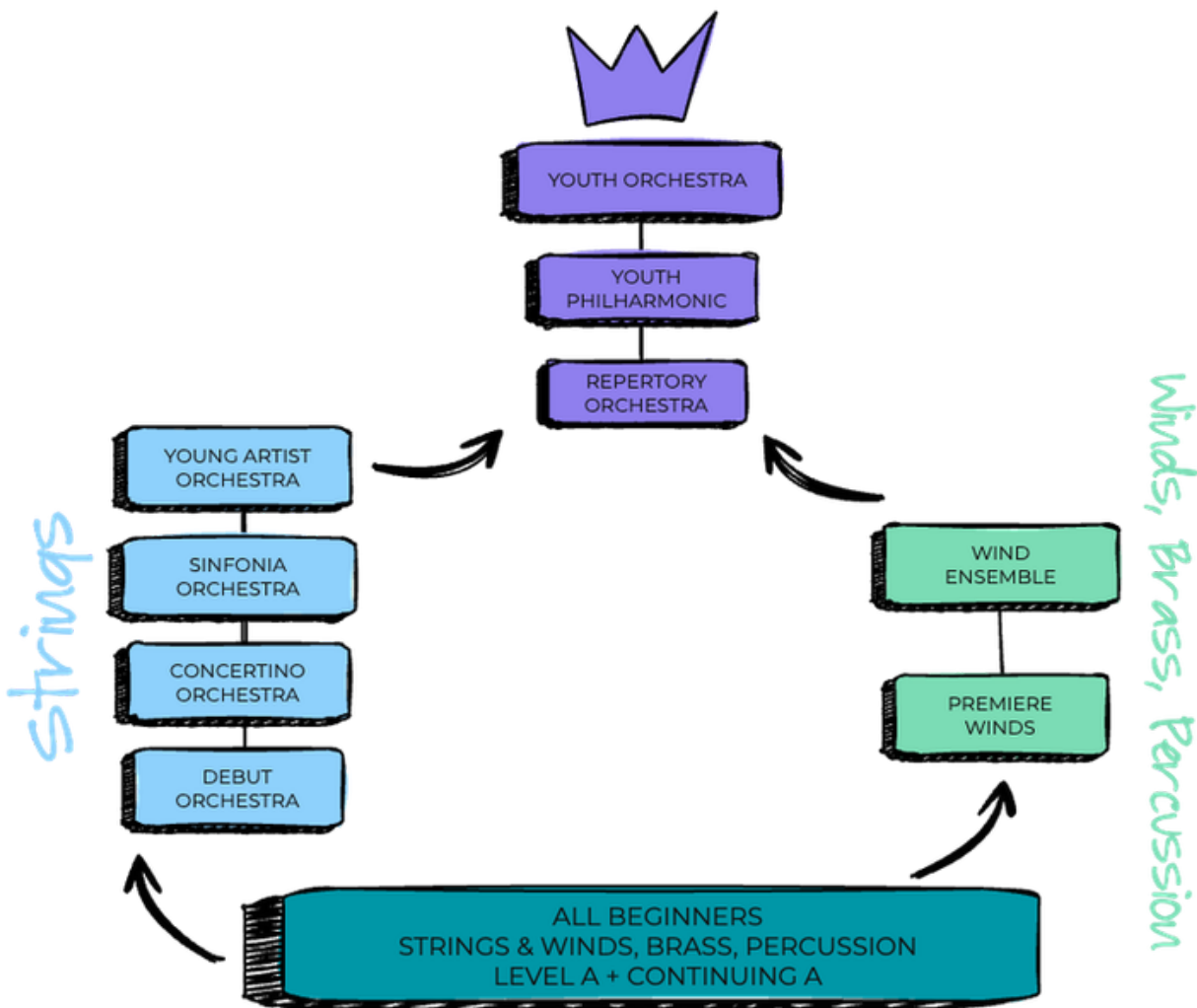
DCPS/DCYOP Building Policy: DCYOP must follow DCPS policies regarding facility access, entrance, and buildings.

- All adults must present their ID to TES Security upon entering the building.
- Parent participants for beginners are allowed one adult per student. Multiple adults or siblings are not permitted in the classroom.
- Additional parents and family members are welcome to wait in the school's annex during classes or rehearsals.

PLACEMENTS FOR *Beginners*

If your child is new to music, we welcome your family with arms wide open! The DCYOP staff and teaching artists are skilled at helping students build strong musical foundations and in helping them grow with confidence at their own pace. This program is not remedial—it is intentionally structured to support long-term musical development.

Music is a shared journey. We will be with you every step of the way.

Placement at Beginner Levels:

Beginners are grouped into levels to best support their learning. Currently, DCYOP offers more than 40 beginner classes for new students to music.

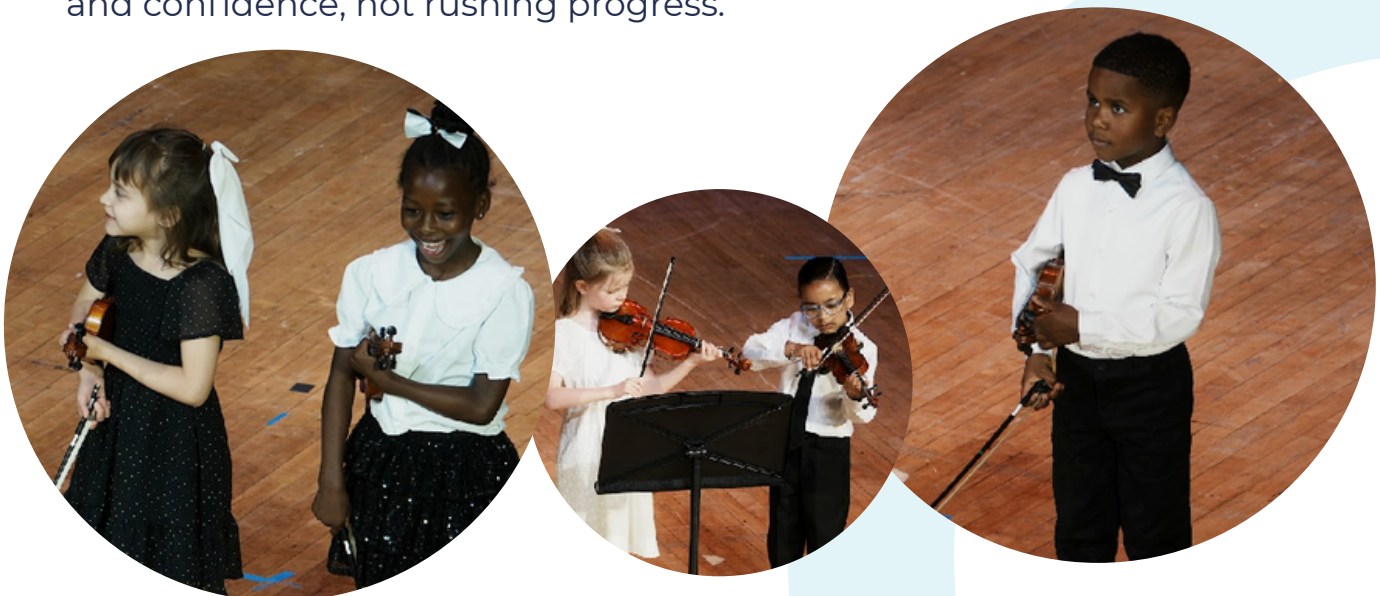
- Level A - typically students who are brand new to music or have less than one year of experience on their instrument.

By the end of the year, students may:

- Advance to a Beginner Ensemble or
- Continue in Level A to further strengthen their skills

Many students spend approximately two years in the Beginner Program.

This is normal and encouraged, as our focus is on building music literacy and confidence, not rushing progress.



PROGRESS *Checks*

For beginner students, we don't hold formal progress checks. Instead, since this is a full year program, teachers will provide feedback to students prior to winter break and an overall assessment at the end of the year.

Winter Feedback:

Teachers will provide each student with input on items they can work on over the winter break to continue their growth.

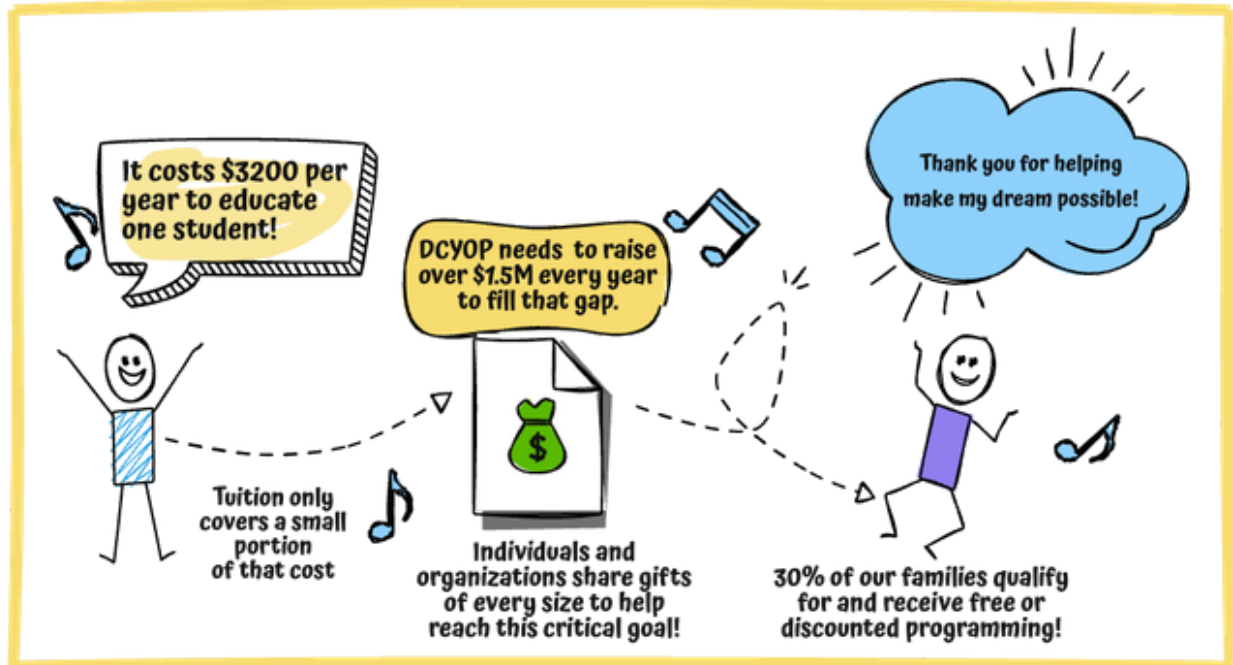
Spring Feedback:

Each Spring, teachers provide an overall evaluation for each student, with notes and practice tips, based on progress over the entire year. This is a progress report designed to help them continuing their growth, not an assessment.
